Message for New Year

When reflecting upon the conclusion of the year, we have a tendency to focus on what we were unable to accomplish and feel sorry for ourselves. The challenge is to focus on all the good that Hashem has done for us during the course of the year and see how we can modify our behaviors towards Him, allowing for much more good to happen to us during the course of the upcoming year.

Whenever I speak to one of my brothers, his response to the question of how he is doing is Chasdei Hashem, through the kindnesses of Hashem. If we are able to introduce this concept into our mindset we can transform our focus in life that has been cultivated by a society that looks at all of our glasses as half empty into viewing our glasses as completely full.

In the words of rebuke in Parshas Ki Savo, the Torah says that why will all of these terrible calamities that the Jewish people have seen come true throughout the generations take place? Because we did not serve Hashem with great joy and gladness of the heart, *mairov kol*. From the majority of everything. The question is asked what does the majority of everything mean?

The answer goes back to the encounter of Yaakov and Esav in Parshas Vayishlach. When Yaakov and Esav are talking about what they have, Esav says *yeish Li Rav*, I have most of what I need. Yaakov, however says, *ki chanani Elokim vichi yesh li chol*, because Hashem has found favor in me and I have ALL that I need. After Esav's son Elifaz took everything that Yaakov had, is it possible that Yaakov has everything he needs?! Rather Yaakov is teaching a perspective to his children for future generations.

The words of rebuke are because we view the *kol*, the everything that we have as *rov*, as only most of what I need and therefore, when we are unable to find the perspective of Yaakov avinu and realize the ALL that we have is through the graces of hashem, we run the risk of history repeating itself with terrible disasters befalling the Jewish people.

Whether it be relating to the shul, our personal lives, our professional lives or any other aspect of our lives, we need to focus on the *Chasdei Hashem*, the great kindness that Hashem provides to us not only on a daily basis, but on a minute to minute basis, every day of the year,

If we are able to focus on the positive and begin appreciating all the Hashem does provide to us, we hope and pray that Hashem will bless ourselves, our families and all of Klal Yisrael with a year of health, happiness, parnasa for all who need and true lasting peace for the people of Israel.

Yaffa and the children join me in wishing to all a *shana tova umisuka*, a happy, healthy and sweet new year.
